WASHINGTON vs. OREGON STATE Dawgs Close Out 2014 Home Slate vs. Beavers

THE GAME: The Washington football team (6-5 overall, 2-5 Pac-12) plays its final home game of the season Saturday night at 7:30 p.m. as Oregon State (5-5, 2-5) visits. The winner will become bowl eligible as each team still has its rivalry game remaining on the schedule the following Saturday. The game will air on the Pac-12 Networks. Following the OSU game, the Dawgs will wrap up the regular season with the Apple Cup Nov. 29 vs. Washington State in Pullman.

QUICK SLANTS: Washington leads the nation with seven defensive touchdowns (four by Shaq Thompson, two from John Timu, one from Travis Feeney) ... Temple and Georgia Tech have each scored six, and two other teams have five ... Washington ranks second in the nation with 40 sacks... senior Hau'oli Kikaha, who has broken both the UW season and career sacks records, leads the nation (tied) with 16.5 sacks ... Kikaha also leads the nation in tackles for loss (22.5) ... Danny Shelton ranks 10th in TFLs (16.0) and 12th in sacks (8.5) ... with 23 takeaways and 13 turnovers, the Huskies' turnover margin of plus-10 is eighth in the nation ... the Huskies' 14 fumble recoveries are fourth-most in the nation ... with a 141.17 rating, Husky QB Cyler Miles ranks No. 33 in the nation in pass efficiency, five spots behind WSU's Connor Halliday, nine spots higher than Stanford's Kevin Hogan, 23 spots in front of Arizona's Anu Salomon and 24 places ahead of OSU's Sean Mannion ... UW opponents have just 43 punt returns yards while UW punt returner Dante Pettis has 278 by himself ... Pettis scored on an 87-yard punt return at Colorado, the first punt return for a TD by a Husky since 2003 ... Shelton and Shaq Thompson share the national lead (with three others) for fumble recoveries, with four ... Thompson has scored four defensive touchdowns this season (plus two more on offense) ... Thompson's 100-yard fumble return at Cal is one of just five 100-yard plays in UW history ... John Ross has two of those five with his 100-yard kick return last season vs. BYU and this season vs. UCLA ... Ross' six touchdowns this season have had an average length of 71.2 yards ... Ross (WR and CB) and Thompson (LB and TB) have each started on offense and defense this season ... UW has had eight true freshmen play this year: DB Budda Baker, DL Will Dissly, DB Darren Gardenhire, DB Naijriel Hale, DB Sidney Jones, WR Brayden Lenius, WR Pettis and PK Tristan Vizcaino ... Baker, Jones, Hale, Pettis and Lenius have started.

TELEVISION: The Washington-Oregon State game will air live to a national audience on the Pac-12 Networks with Roxy Bernstein (play-by-play), Anthony Herron (color) and Guy Haberman (sideline) providing the commentary. The Pac-12 will also re-air one-hour versions of the game the following week.

RADIO: The Washington IMG College Network, with its flagship station KOMO AM-1000 and FM-97.7, will carry the live broadcast of every football game on 18 Northwest radio stations. Longtime play-by-play man Bob Rondeau and color analyst Damon Huard are joined by sideline reporter Elise Woodward. The UW broadcast of the game will also air on Sirius (139) and XM (197) satellite radio.

THE HEAD COACH: Chris Petersen, who has built a reputation as an offensive innovator who carried the Boise State football program to its highest highs, was finally swayed to take on a new challenge when he agreed to become head coach of the Huskies in December of 2013. Petersen, 49, the only two-time winner of the Paul "Bear" Bryant Award (2006 and 2009), compiled an exceptional 92-12 record in his eight seasons as Boise State head coach (2006-2013), including two unbeaten seasons (13-0 in 2006 and 14-0 in 2009) and two BCS bowl berths. He won five conference titles and posted a 57-6 record in conference play (WAC from 2006-10 and Mountain West from 2011-13). Petersen, who also won the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award in 2010, led the Broncos to 10 or more wins in seven of his eight seasons and to 12 or more in four straight (2008-11). In 2006, Petersen's first season in charge in Boise, he led the Broncos to their first undefeated season since 1958, when the school was a junior college. The 2006 season was capped by a 43-42 overtime win over Oklahoma in the Fiesta Bowl, a game remembered by many as one of the greatest in bowl-game history. That Boise team ended the year ranked No. 5 in the final Associated Press top 25 poll. The following season, the Broncos went 10-3 and finished out of the polls for what would be the only time in Petersen's first seven seasons. The 2008 squad went 12-1 and ranked No. 11 in the final top 25, finishing the regular season undefeated. In 2009, Petersen led the Broncos to their second undefeated campaign and another Fiesta Bowl berth. Boise State beat TCU, 17-10, in Arizona, becoming the first team from a non-BCS conference ever to win two BCS bowl games. The '09 Broncos checked in at No. 4 in the final AP poll. The 2010 season ended with a 12-1 record, a No. 9 final ranking and a win in the Las Vegas Bowl, the first of three straight trips to Vegas for Boise State. In 2011, BSU once again went 12-1, finishing with a No. 8 final ranking. Last season, Petersen's team went 11-2 and beat Washington in the Las Vegas Bowl, good for a No. 18 final ranking. In 2013, Boise State, which faced Washington in the first game at the newly renovated Husky Stadium, finished the regular season with an 8-4 record (Petersen came to the UW prior to the Broncos' bowl game). Throughout his teams' unmatched on-field success, Petersen also saw his Broncos succeed in the classroom. In 2011, Boise State was the only school to finish in the top 10 in both major polls and also receive a Public Recognition Award from the NCAA for finishing in the top 10 percent of the Academic Progress Rate (APR), the second of three straight such awards for the program. Boise State's APR was second in the nation in 2011 and 2012 and Petersen was recognized in 2012 for having the best APR for the two previous years among all FBS coaches. Known for his work with quarterbacks, Petersen tutored Ryan Dinwiddie, Jared Zabransky and Kellen Moore at Boise State. Moore set an NCAA record with 50 career wins as a starting QB while winning three conference player of the year awards. Moore was the only player ever to record four 3,000-yard seasons in both passing and total offense. His 142 passing touchdowns were second-most in NCAA history while his 14,667 career passing yards were fifth-most. He twice led the nation in passing efficiency and set an NCAA record for season interception percentage, throwing just three in 431 attempts in 2009. During his eight seasons seasons, 51 Broncos earned all-conference honors. Before taking over as head coach at Boise State, Petersen served as the Broncos' offensive coordinator from 2001-05, during which his teams averaged 41.3 points per game, leading the nation in scoring in both 2002 and 2003. Petersen began his coaching career in 1987 as freshman coach at his alma mater, UC Davis. In 1989, he became the Aggies' varsity wide receivers coach. In 1992, Petersen moved to Pittsburgh, where he was quarterbacks coach. That season, Alex Van Pelt passes for more than 3,100 yards and 20 touchdowns. In 1993, Petersen moved back west to take over a QBs coach at Portland State, helping the Vikings to Division II playoff berths in each of his two seasons. In 1995, he took a job at Oregon as the receivers coach under Mike Bellotti, a position he held before moving to Boise as offensive coordinator in 2001. Born in Yuba City, Calif., on Oct. 13, 1964, Petersen graduated from Yuba City High in 1983 and went on to play quarterback at Sacramento City College. From there, he transferred to UC Davis, earning a bachelor's degree in psychology in 1988. He

later earned a master's in educational psychology from Davis. At Davis, he set numerous school records, including the single-season standards for passing efficiency, completions, completion percentage, touchdown passes and total offense as well as the career mark for completion percentage. He still remains in the top 10 in Aggies history in numerous season and career categories and his season and career completion percentage records still stand. In 1986, Petersen was named the Northern California Athletic Conference Player of the Year and earned UC Davis' Colby E. Slater Award as the school's Male Athlete of the Year. He was also a captain and won the team's Jerry Norris Award (Most Valuable and Inspirational). He was inducted into the Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997. Petersen and his wife, Barbara, are parents of two sons, Jack and Sam.

PETERSEN TOPS LIST: The 2014 NCAA record book lists the top active FBS coaches in terms of winning percentage (minimum five years at FBS) and the Huskies' own Chris Petersen tops this list. Petersen's .885 career winning percentage entering the season was No. 3 in the country for all NCAA levels behind only Lance Leipold of Wisconsin-Whitewater (.940) and Chuck Martin (.914), who is in his first season at Miami (Ohio) having compiled his entire previous W-L record at Grand Valley State. Here are the top 10 FBS coaches by career winning percentage, at the start of the 2014 season:

PETERSEN'S FIRST FIVE: The NCAA Record Book also notes that Petersen won more games in his first season as a head coach (13-0 in 2006) than any coach in history and that his record over his first five seasons as a head coach (61-5) was fifth-best in history, ahead of the likes of Knute Rockne and Bud Wilkinson and behind coaching legends like Gil Dobie and Walter Camp. Here are the 10-best coaching performances over the first five years of a career:

COACHING STAFF: With a new head coach on board for 2014, the Husky coaching staff obviously includes mostly new faces. In fact, of the nine full-time coaches on the 2014 staff, six worked for Chris Petersen last year at Boise State. Defensive coordinator Pete Kwiatkowski was on Petersen's staff in Boise in all eight seasons as head coach, including the last four as coordinator. Kwiatkowski, a BSU Hall-of-Fame defensive lineman, also worked at his alma mater from 1988 to 1996. Associate head coach and offensive line coach Chris Strausser spent 12 of the last 13 seasons coaching in Boise (he coached at Colorado in 2006), meaning he was with Petersen seven of eight seasons. Running backs coach and recruiting coordinator Keith Bhonapha was also on Petersen's Broncos staff during Petersen's entire eight seasons, though he started as director of operations. He's coached running backs the last five years at BSU. Assistant head coach and linebackers coach Bob Gregory comes to Washington

having spent the last four seasons at Boise State. He was the defensive coordinator at California from 2002 to 2009 and, along with also having coached at Boise State in 2001, has also worked in the conference at Oregon. Former Oregon State quarterback Jonathan Smith, who turned in several top-class performances vs. the Huskies during his playing days, was quarterbacks coach at Boise State the last two seasons. Previously an offensive coordinator at Montana, he takes that role (along with QBs) at Washington. Defensive backs coach Jimmy Lake, who spent the 2004 season in the same position at Washington under head coach Keith Gilbertson, was Petersen's DBs coach in Boise the last two years, having spent five seasons in the NFL before that. Wide receivers coach Brent Pease worked at BSU under Petersen for his first six seasons as head coach. The former standout quarterback at Montana, Pease returned to the Northwest after having coached at Florida the last two seasons. Defensive line coach and special teams coordinator Jeff Choate has a similar recent history as he worked under Petersen from 2006 through 2011 before going to Washington State in 2012 and Florida in 2013. Among the nine full-time assistants, the only returner from the 2013 season is tight ends coach Jordan Paopao, who served in that same role in 2013 after having worked as a UW grad assistant in 2011 and 2012, when he was also in charge of tight ends. The UW staff for four grad assistants in 2014 includes one returner and three newcomers. The returner is former UW and NFL wideout D'Andre Goodwin, who's back for his second year. He's joined by Ben Thienes, Joshua Taufalele and Gerald Alexander. Thienes was a GA at Boise State last season while Alexander was a standout DB at Boise State before playing in the NFL for five years. Taufalele is new to both UW and Petersen. The former offensive lineman at New Mexico most recently coached at Foothill College in California.

HUSKIES vs. BEAVERS HISTORY: Washington holds a 60-34-4 record in the all-time series against Oregon State, having won the 18 of the last 26 meetings and 28 of the last 37, dating back to 1975. The series against the Beavers is the second-longest (to Stanford) active series in Washington football history in terms of years and third-longest in terms of total meetings (to Oregon and Washington State). The teams first met on Dec. 4, 1897, with Oregon State earning a 16-0 home win. That game was Washington's second-ever against a major college. The next OSU-UW game didn't come until 1902, a 16-6 UW win. Last year in Corvallis, Washington rushed for 537 yards and seven TDs en route to a 69-27 win. Three Husky backs ran for more than 100 yards (Bishop Sankey, 179; Deontae Cooper, 166; Dwayne Washington, 141) in QB Cyler Miles first UW start. Two seasons ago in Seattle, Washington handed a 6-0 OSU squad its first loss in a 20-17 victory at CenturyLink Field. The winning score came on a 30-yard field goal from Travis Coons with one minute, 20 seconds remaining. In 2011 at OSU, the Beavers upset the UW with a 38-21 victory. In 2010 in Seattle, Washington won 35-34 in two overtimes, denying a two-point conversion for the winning play. Jake Locker tied a school record with five TD passes, including four to Jermaine Kearse. In 2009 at OSU, the Beavers got 159 rushing yards from Jacquizz Rodgers to roll to a 48-21 win over the Huskies. In 2008 in Seattle, James Rodgers rushed for 110 yards on only three carries and Lyle Moevao was 18-for-22 for 191 yards to lead OSU past the UW, 34-13. The 2007 game in Corvallis was memorable for an injury to Locker, controversial calls from referees and five Alexis Serna field goals in a 29-23 Beavers win. In 2006 in Seattle, QB Isaiah Stanback's college career came to an end with a devastating foot injury and the Huskies' lost, 27-17. In 2005, the Beavers got six field goals from Serna in an 18-10 win over Washington. In 2004 at Husky Stadium, OSU picked up its second win in four seasons against the UW with

a 29-14 win, the Beavers first at Husky Stadium since 1985. Serna kicked a then-school-record five field goals to provide the winning margin. In 2003 in Corvallis, Charles Frederick piled up a school-record 371 all-purpose yards, scoring three touchdowns, as the Huskies cruised to a 38-17 win. The Beavers' next-most recent win (prior to 2004) in the series came in Corvallis on Nov. 10, 2001, when the Beavers broke a 13-game losing streak to the Huskies. That day, an unranked OSU team trounced No. 8 Washington, 49-24, the first Beaver win (home or away) since the 1985 Husky Stadium game. Several other recent meetings have come down to the wire. In 2000, Ryan Cesca missed a game-tying field goal in the closing seconds as the Huskies held on for a 33-30 win. In 1998, the Beavers went for a two-point conversion with no time left. The pass attempt was batted down by Husky safety Nigel Burton and the Huskies won, 35-34.

WASHINGTON-OREGON STATE TIES: Washington offensive line coach Chris Strausser was a graduate assistant coach at Oregon State in 1990-91. OSU special teams coach Bruce Read was on the staff at Montana during Husky receivers coach Brent Pease's tenure both as the Grizzlies' quarterback and as an assistant coach, in the early-to-mid 1990s. Read's father, Don Read, was the Grizzlies' head coach when Pease was a starting QB in 1986. Fourth-year OSU receivers coach Brent Brennan was a graduate assistant at the UW in 1999. Oregon State's current roster includes 10 players who graduated from Washington high schools: OL Drew Clarkson (Camas), TE Kellen Clute (Mt. Spokane), WR Rahmel Dockery (Curtis), TE Connor Hamlett (Meadowdale), OL Mason Johnson (Kentlake), OL Josh Mitchell (Mount Si), QB Nick Mitchell (Mount Si), LB Caleb Saulo (Kentlake), TE Caleb Smith (Kentrledge) and TE Dustin Stanton (Lakewood). Washington's current roster includes just two players from the state of Oregon: senior OL James Atoe (The Dalles-Wahntonka) and RS-freshman OL Andrew Kirkland (Portland/Jesuit). Kirkland attended Jesuit High, as did Beaver Ryan Cope and Jacob Wark. Husky kicker Cameron Van Winkle is a graduate of Mount Si, as are the Beavers' Mitchell brothers. Several other Huskies and Beavers attended the same high school somewhere other than Washington or Oregon: UW's DiAndre Campbell and OSU's Ryan Murphy (Oakland Tech); UW's Psalm Wooching and OSU's Manase Hungalu (Kealakehe); UW's Jesse Sosebee and OSU's Roman Sapolu (Edison); UW's Hau'oli Kikaha and OSU's LaMone Williams (Kahuku); and UW's Jaylen Johnson and OSU's Trevor Romaine and Larry Scott (Corona Centennial). Finally, Beaver Michael Morovick is the younger brother of former UW snapper Danny Morovick.

DAWGS AND THE NORTHWEST: Washington's most-played rivalries are against the other three other northwest Pac-12 schools. The Huskies have faced Washington State 106 times, Oregon in 107 games and Oregon State on 98 occasions. Washington owns the advantage in all three series. The Huskies lead the Ducks 58-44-5, Washington State 68-32-6 and Oregon State 60-34-4. Combined, Washington has a 186-110-15 (.622) record against its northwest rivals. Washington has played all three of the Northwest teams in a season on 85 prior occasions. Over those 85 seasons in which Oregon, OSU and WSU were all on the UW schedule, the Dawgs have swept all three 28 times. In the meantime, the Huskies have lost to all three in the same season on only seven occasions.

THE PAC-12: Prior to the 2011 season, the Pac-10 Conference added Utah and Colorado to expand to the Pac-12. Washington, which along with California is one of two schools who have been in the conference since its founding in 1915, plays in the Pac-12 North, along with the other three Northwest schools (Oregon, OSU, WSU) and Stanford and California. Under current plans, each school will play all five division rivals, plus four of six teams in the other division each season. The first two seasons, the Huskies did not face UCLA or Arizona State. Last year and in 2013, the Huskies don't face Utah or USC.

THE 100-YARD FACTOR: Since the 1947 season, Washington is 193-61-3 (.757) when a Husky player rushes for 100 yards in a game. The Huskies are 2-2 in such games this season (EWU, Colorado, UCLA, Arizona).

HISTORY LESSON: Successfully rushing the football and winning go hand-in-hand for the Huskies. Since 1990, UW has rushed for 200 yards in a game 94 times. The Huskies' record stands at 77-16-1 (.824) in those contests. Since 1995, UW is 52-13-1 (.795) when rushing for 200 yards.

HUSKY STADIUM RENOVATION: Husky Stadium underwent a major renovation over from Nov., 2011, through Aug., 2013, as the entire lower bowl and south upper deck were demolished and replaced. The new facility features a new, state-of-the-art football operations center (weight room, training room, locker room, meeting rooms, coaches' offices) in the west end, much more premium seating options and a new playing surface. Husky Stadium had featured a track up until 2011, so seats that were once far from the field, particularly in the west end, are much closer to the action. For much more information, including a virtual look from every seat in the new stadium, photo galleries, live construction cams, and more, go to huskystadium.com.

HISTORIC HUSKY STADIUM: The Oregon game on Nov. 5, 2011, marked the final game in Husky Stadium prior to major renovations that have now been completed. The Huskies re-opened their home field with a 38-6 win over then-No. 19 Boise State on Aug. 31, 2013. The 2014 season marks the 94th season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium stands at 366-173-21 (.672).
