SERIES HISTORY Oregon State trails the series 34-60-4

IT'S ON US: Oregon State University in conjunction with the Pac-12 Conference is proud to be a part of the national "It's On Us" campaign to create awareness of sexual violence. For more information go to itsonus.org or oregonstate.edu.

BIG GAME NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK: Oregon State earned the Big Game National Team of the Week honor for its 35-27 win over No. 7 Arizona State last Saturday at Reser Stadium. It was the Beavers' fourth such honor since the award was initiated by the Football Writers Association of America in 2002.



THE SERIES

- Saturday is the 99th meeting in the series that dates back to 1897.
- UW leads the overall series 60-34-4 and has won two straight and three of the last four.
- UW has won the last two games in Seattle by scores of 35-34 (OT) in '10 and 20-17 in '12.
- UW won last year in Corvallis 69-27 - the most points ever allowed by OSU.
- Former Beaver Brandin Cooks had 117 yards receiving last year in the game and thus became the school record holder for single season receiving yards with 1,560.
- Beaver **Victor Bolden** returned a kickoff 98 yards for a TD last year, the fourth-longest in OSU history. Bolden set the Pac-12 record for total kickoff return yards for one game with 305 yards (12 returns).
- OSU had a 6-game win streak in the series, its longest, between 2004-09. Four of those wins were in Seattle, including back-to-back-to-back years.
- OSU did not win a game in the series between 1986-2000, and won only once between 1975-2000 - the famed 1985 21-20 victory at Husky Stadium as then the biggest underdog to win a game in NCAA history (38 points) at the time.
- Notable current records in the series: Most field goals in one game (6, Alexis Serna, Nov. 5, '05); Most kickoff return yards in Pac-12 history (305, **Victor Bolden**, 2014); Most points allowed by OSU (69, **Sean Mannion**, 2014).

UW COORDINATOR/OSU RECORD HOLDER: Washington offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Jonathan Smith was a four-year letterman QB at OSU 1998-2001. Smith joined the OSU program as a walk-on quarterback from Glendora, Calif., in August of 1997 during the initial season of Beaver head coach Mike Riley's first tenure (1997-98). Smith's first OSU appearance was in the '98 season opener vs. Nevada (1-for-2 for 7 yds). He got his first chance to run the Beaver first team Oct. 17, '98 vs. Arizona coming in for injured starter Terrance Bryant. The following week he once again entered the contest for an ailing Bryant at Husky Stadium – initially in the second quarter and then again in the third quarter. Smith proceeded to pass for 469 yards against the Huskies, a then Beaver record. From that point, Smith was the starter through the 2001 season that included the Beavers winning the 2000 Fiesta Bowl (co-Pac-10 champions) and playing in the '99 Oahu Bowl. He passed for 9,680 career yards, since passed by Derek Anderson (11,249) and Sean Mannion (13,124). Smith left OSU as the all-time leader for passing yards, single season yards (3,053/99), single season touchdowns (20/2000) and career touchdowns (55). He still holds the school record with a 97-yard pass to Chad Johnson against Stanford in 2010. UW associate head coach Chris Strausser also has OSU ties, serving as a graduate assistant for the Beavers 1990-91.

THERE'S BEEN A MOROVICK ON THE FIELD SINCE 2006: There has been a member of the Morovick family on the field in the UW-OSU series since 2006. Danny Morovick, the brother of current Beaver **Michael Morovick**, lettered as a Husky longsnapper from 2006-09. Michael has been OSU's long snapper for the 2012-14 seasons, after redshirting in 2010 and did not see game action in 2011.

SIMPLY THE BEST: Beaver QB **Sean Mannion** is the new record holder for career passing yards in the Pac-12 with 13,124. He is on his way, at his current season average, for 13,752 yards which would be the eighth-highest total in NCAA history behind Case Keenum, Houston (19,217), Timmy Chang, Hawai'i (17,072), Landry Jones, Oklahoma (16,646), Graham Harrell, Texas Tech (15,793), Ty Detmer, BYU (15,031), Kellen Moore, Boise State (14,667), and Colt Brennan, Hawai'i (14,193) and Philip Rivers, N.C. State (13,484). In addition, Taylor Heinicke from Old Dominion currently has 14,375 yards, but not all of his yards technically count toward the FBS list due to ODU's reclassifying from the FCS level.

41,474: The number of yards Oregon State quarterbacks have thrown for since Beaver head coach **Mike Riley** returned to the sideline for his second tenure at the start of the 2003 season. That equates to 23.6 miles, the most in the league during the timeframe.

BOWL ELIGIBLE: A win Saturday at Washington would make Oregon State bowl eligible for the third consecutive year and ninth time in head coach **Mike Riley's** tenure at the helm of the Beavers. OSU is 6-2 in bowl games under Riley.

THEY NEED 7, WE NEED 6: Both OSU and UW played at Hawai'i this season which enables a team to schedule 13 regular season games. OSU chose to have a bye instead of a 13th game – thus it needs six wins to be bowl eligible. UW chose to play the extra game, which means it needs seven wins to qualify for a bowl.

HEAD COACH MIKE RILEY

Mike Riley is often referred to as "the best guy in college football" but he also ranks among the top coaches in the game. He owns the most wins ever at Oregon State with 93, the team has been ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 28 weeks, has coached players who have earned 32 All-American honors, and has had 32 NFL Draft picks including First Round selections Steven Jackson (2004) and Brandin Cooks (2014).



The longest tenured coach in the Pac-12, in his 14th season, has a résumé that sparkles with achievements. He was the 2008 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), Pac-10 Conference and State of Oregon Coach of the Year, and his teams have appeared in the final Associated Press top-25 rankings in three of the last seven seasons.

The 61-year-old head coach has guided the Beavers to eight bowl games in the last 11 years, winning six, and started the rejuvenation of the program during his first tenure in 1997-98 that subsequently made three postseason appearances.

Riley has 57 Pac-10/12 victories which is 11th in the conference record book.

A former head coach for the NFL's San Diego Chargers, Riley was hired as OSU's head coach for the second time Feb. 19, 2003.

He has also led his team to outstanding success in the classroom, where over the last six years Beavers have been honored by the league for academic achievement 70 times.

Riley is the first coach in OSU history to win more than one NCAA-sanctioned bowl game at OSU. He also is the first coach to lead the program to more than one winning conference season (2004, '06, '07, '08, '09 & '12) since 1969.

SCHOOL RECORD COACH: Mike Riley continues to build on his school record for victories, now with 93 (93-78). He has 58 league wins, which is 11th in Pac-12 history. Riley's overall league record is 58-61 (14 of those losses in his first era of 1997-98) - his second tenure (2003-present) league mark is 56-47. Riley is the longest tenured coach in the Pac-12 in his 14th year at OSU; the rest of the league entering the '14 season includes Kyle Whittingham, Utah (10 yrs), Steve Sarkisian, UW/USC (6), David Shaw, Stanford (4), Todd Graham, ASU (3), Mike Leach, WSU (3), Rich Rodriguez, Arizona (3), Sonny Dykes, Cal (2), Mark Helfrich, Oregon (2), Mike MacIntyre, Colorado (2) and Chris Peterson, UW (1). Riley finished second in an ESPN poll of FBS coaches the week of Sept. 15 2014 for being the most underrated coach (Rice's David Bailiff was first).

THE NEW COORDINATOR: For the first time since the 2005 season, OSU has a new coordinator in the coaching staff. Longtime offensive coordinator Danny Langsdorf (2005-13) left the program in January to return to the NFL with the New York Giants as quarterbacks coach. Langsdorf replacement is **John Garrett**, who has had a lengthy NFL coaching career with the Cowboys (his brother Jason is the head coach), Bengals, Cardinals and Buccaneers, as well as in college at Virginia. Garrett also coaches the quarterbacks and tight ends with the contributions of graduate assistant coach **Tavita Thompson**.

60 YEARS: No other team in the Pac-12 can boast as much NFL coaching experience as the Beavers. OSU's full-time coaches have 60 years of NFL experience, including **Mike Riley** as the head coach of the San Diego Chargers. Here is a closer look - **Mike Riley** (4 years), **Mark Bunker** (3), **Bruce Read** (7), **Mike Cavanaugh** (2), **John Garrett** (19), **Rod Perry** (23) and **Chris Brasfield** (2).

BEAVS AT 109: Oregon owns the most victories in the Pac-12 Conference this century with 142, followed by USC (140/116 with vacated wins), OSU (109), Arizona State (102), UCLA (101), Stanford (98), Cal (92), Washington (85), Arizona (84), WSU (75). Non-traditional Pac-12 teams Utah has 122 victories this century and Colorado has 73. The Beavers hit the 100-win plateau this century in the Sept. 21, 2013 win at San Diego State. The previous 100-win stretch started during the 1966 season, ending with 1999 - nearly 34 seasons (365 games). This century's 100 victories were achieved in just over 13 seasons (168 games).

EARLY DEPARTURES: Juniors Brandin Cooks and Scott Crichton elected to forgo their senior seasons and enter the NFL Draft, becoming the fourth and fifth Beavers to do so joining Steven Jackson, Brandon Browner and Jacquizz Rodgers. Cooks, a consensus All-American and Biletnikoff Award winner, set new Pac-12 single season marks for receptions with 128 and yards with 1,730 (NCAA leader in 2013). He accounted for 226 receptions for 3,272 yards and 26 total touchdowns (24 rec, 2 rush) during his illustrious career. Overall, he compiled 3,863 all-purpose yards. Crichton made 165 career tackles for the Beavers, including 51 tackles-for-loss and 22.5 quarterback sacks. He ranks third all-time at OSU for tackles-for-loss and fourth for quarterback sacks.

OTHER SCHEDULE NOTES: There are several oddities to this year's schedule for the Beavers. Here is a closer look:

- OSU and Cal are the only teams to have a streak of three consecutive home league games.
- The Beavers, Arizona, Arizona State, Utah and Washington are the only teams to play on the last six dates of the season.
- Oregon State is the only "Power 5 Conference" team that ends the season with four home games in the last five dates.
- Oregon State is the only team that began the Pac-12 portion of the season with two road games and was the only team to play three of its first four league games away.
- Oregon State is one of four Power 5 teams that only played three home games in the first full eight weeks of the season.

TEAM CAPTAINS: Quarterback **Sean Mannion** is serving as a co-team captain for the third consecutive year – no Beaver prior has ever been a captain for three seasons. Linebacker **Michael Doctor** is in the co-captain role for the second straight year. Safety **Ryan Murphy** and center **Isaac Seumalo** are in their first years with the leadership honor.

YOUNG RECEIVERS: With the loss of junior receiver **Richard Mullaney**, the Beavers possess the youngest starting receiving corps in the Pac-12. OSU anticipates starting **Victor Bolden** (So.), **Jordan Villamin** (Fr-RS) and **Hunter Jarmon** (Fr-RS) Saturday. No other team in the league starts more than one freshman or sophomore per the latest depth charts made available by the schools.

YOUNG RECEIVERS II: The young corps of receivers are starting to show more confidence of late. Here is a closer look:

RUNNING BACK U: Oregon State is the only program in the Pac-12 Conference with three running backs that rank in the top 10 for career rushing in the league; 3. Ken Simonton (1998-2001), 5,044 yards; 8. Jacquizz Rodgers (2008-10), 3,877; 9. Yvenson Bernard (2004-07), 3,862. Steven Jackson (2001-03) ranks 14th with 3,625 yards. Rodgers and Jackson both left OSU after three seasons to enter the NFL.

100-PLUS USUALLY A W: When a Beaver rushes for 100-plus yards it usually equals a victory. OSU has won 30 of its last 36 games (83%) when a rusher gains 100 – the only six losses in that period -- Oct. 2, 2008 at Utah (Jacquizz Rodgers 101 yds), Oct. 24, 2009 at USC (Jacquizz 113), Oct. 16, 2010 at Washington (Jacquizz 140), Sept. 3, 2011 vs. Sacramento State (Malcolm Agnew 223), Dec. 29, 2012 vs. Texas (**Storm Woods** 118) and Nov. 29 vs. Oregon (**Terron Ward** 145).

RUSHING SIGNIFICANTLY BETTER: While still not satisfied, Beaver head coach **Mike Riley** has witnessed significant improvement in the run game from a year ago. The Beavers already have more touchdowns rushing this season with 18 than they did all of last year with 15.

IMPROVED GROUND GAME CONTINUES: The Beavers have rushed for 1,224 net yards this season in 10 games, that's just three yards shy off the season total for last year in 13 games. Both **Terron Ward** (148 yds) and **Storm Woods** (125 yds) went over the 100-yard mark last week vs. Arizona State - it was the first time two Beaver backs had reached the 100-yard threshold in the same game since the 2007 Emerald Bowl vs. Maryland.

ROMAINE OR OWENS; SAME RESULT: For several reasons, the Beavers have used two placekickers this season - senior **Trevor Romaine** and freshman-redshirt **Garrett Owens**. The duo have combined to make 18 of 21 field goal attempts for the best percentage in the Pac-12 at .857.

594: That's the number of combined tackles for the Beavers' three starting linebackers - **Michael Doctor** (244), **D.J. Alexander** (198) and **Jabral Johnson** (152). OSU's senior trio is one of the most experienced, if not the most experienced, linebacker corps in the Pac-12. For the first time since 2007 the Beavers started three senior linebackers in the season opener.

TURNOVERS: Over the last four seasons (48 games) OSU has forced 99 turnovers, fourth-most in the conference and 15th in the nation. Here is a closer look courtesy of ESPN: Oregon (119), Arizona State (113), Washington (102), Oregon State (99), UCLA (91), USC (89), Utah (87), Arizona (83), Stanford (77), Washington State (75), California (73), Colorado (62).

WIN THE TURNOVER BATTLE, WIN THE GAME: Over the last 135 games, Oregon State is 51-11 when committing fewer turnovers than its opponent, 11-36 when committing more and 14-12 when even.

PROTECTING THE BALL: The Beavers are one of the better teams in the nation for taking care of the ball in 2014 - with just 12 turnovers (compared to 26 last season).

ODD IS AWESOME; EVEN NOT SO MUCH: The Beavers have allowed just 81 points (611st/20 3rd) in the odd numbered quarters, but 201 (108 2nd/93 4th) in the even quarters.

80-9: That's the record of Oregon State when it leads after three quarters with **Mike Riley** as head coach. Since the start of the 2004 season it is 60-5.

BOWL HISTORY: Starting with the 1999 season thru 2013, Oregon State has appeared in 11 bowl games - tied for the second-most in the league. Oregon has 14 appearances, followed by OSU (11), Utah (11), USC (11), UCLA (11), Arizona State (10), Cal (8), Washington (8), Stanford (7), Colorado (6), Arizona (5) and Washington State (4).

STINGY DEFENSE: Oregon State's experienced defense has posted 20 quarters of allowing 100 yards or less this season. The Beavers rank second in the Pac-12 for total defense allowing an average of 382.9 yards per game. Here is a closer look.

BEAVER "D" PLAYING WELL DESPITE BEING ON FIELD: OSU's defense remains second in the Pac-12 allowing 382.9 yards per game, despite being on the field of late. Opponents are averaging 17 more offensive plays per game over the last three contests - mostly due to OSU being just 8 of 35 in the time span for 3rd-down conversions, while the opponents are 26 of 49.

60 YEARS AND COUNTING: Oregon State's own Jack Saling has volunteered in the Reser Stadium, formerly Parker Stadium, Press Box for 60 years - the longest active streak in the nation. Jack served as the play-by-play typist for decades before assuming his new role as part of the participation chart tracker. His son Gene is in his 47th year as a volunteer.

LUCKY 9: OSU started nine seniors for the season opener; the most since modern day tracking/records for starters began in 1976.

PENALTY ISSUES: Oregon State is last in the FBS for penalties committed with 95 and are 124th (out of 125 teams) for penalties per game at 9.5. Washington is 100th in the country for penalties per game at 7.1 with fellow Pac-12 teams UCLA, Colorado, Washington State, Oregon, California and USC joining the Beavers and Huskies between the 100-125 list.

FIRST DOWN BEAVERS: OSU has gained 29 first downs via penalties this season, tied for the fourth-most in the NCAA (Arizona leads with 41). However, Beaver opponents have gained 30 first downs via penalty - tied with Colorado with the second-most (USC has allowed 34).

Since the return of head coach **Mike Riley** in 2003, Oregon State's passing offense has been the most prolific in the Pac-10/12 Conference. Beaver quarterbacks, which include two current NFL standouts Derek Anderson (Carolina) and Matt Moore (Miami), have passed for 41,223 yards season (23.4 miles). CORVALLIS — Senior quarterback **Sean Mannion** ran for one touchdown, passed for another and threw for 328 total yards to lead Oregon State's 29-14 victory over Portland State.

An opening-day crowd of 40,309 saw the Beavers (1-0) parlay five second-half turnovers into 16 unanswered points to erase a 14-13 halftime deficit. OSU coach **Mike Riley** improved to 9-5 in season openers on the 10-year anniversary of the east grandstand renovation.

Redshirt freshman placekicker **Garrett Owens**

added five field goals and a two extra points in his debut and became the first player in school history with more than three field goals in his first game. The Beavers (1-0) improved to 4-0 in the all-time series, which dates back to 1983.

Mannion completed 26 of 45 passes to eight different receivers and did not have an interception. He passed the 300-yard mark for the 10th time in his last 14 games, for the 18th time overall, and increased his career total to 10,764 yards.

Senior safety **Tyreek Zimmerman** had his first two career interceptions to lead a defense that cracked down in the second half to hold the Vikings (0-1), one of the top offensive teams in FCS in 2013, to no points and 40 total yards over the final 30 minutes.

Senior tailback **Storm Woods** rushed for 126 yards on 16 carries and added a 23-yard TD reception with 5:07 left in the third quarter that sent the Beavers in front 23-14. It was his fourth career 100-yard game, and his second in a row. He gained 107 against Boise State in the 2013 Hawaii Bowl.

Owens, whose 26-yard field goal with 10:58 in the third quarter put OSU ahead to stay at 16-14, subsequently added 31- and 23-yard field goals for the final margin. His seven attempts were a school record.

OSU took a 3-0 lead at 8:04 of the first quarter when Owens drilled a 25-yard field goal in his first collegiate attempt. A 35-yard Mannion-to-Hamlett hookup set up the kick.

Owens hit from 25 yards again at 1:12 of the first quarter for a 6-0 advantage. A career-long 50-yard Woods run on a third-and-20 play from the OSU 12 moved the Beavers into scoring position.

PSU went ahead 7-6 on a 58-yard run by quarterback Paris Penn but the Beavers answered with an 82-yard scoring drive to take a 13-7 lead. Mannion scrambled the last six yards on a third-and-goal for the go-ahead points with 9:36 left in the second quarter.



HONOLULU — Senior quarterback **Sean Mannion** threw three touchdown passes and Oregon State defeated Hawaii 38-30 at Aloha Stadium.

Mannion completed 26 of 37 passes for 300 yards as the Beavers improved to 2-0 heading into the first of their two bye weeks. Tailback **Terron Ward** rushed for 124 yards and two touchdowns as the Beavers piled up 464 yards of total offense.

Mannion passed Stanford's Steve Stenstrom (10,911) and Washington State's Alex Brink (10,913) to assume fourth place on the Pac-12 career passing yardage list with 11,064 yards. Next to pass is former OSU standout Derek Anderson, who threw for 11,249 yards from 2001-04.

He also moved into a tie with Carson Palmer of USC for 11th place on the all-time touchdown passing list with 72.

The Beavers never trailed and led 38-7 before the in the fourth quarter before the Rainbow Warriors (0-2) rallied for 23 unanswered points. However, an onside kick with 1:35 remaining failed and the Beavers ran out the clock.

OSU took a 7-0 lead at 10:12 of the first quarter on Mannion's 4-yard TD pass to **Richard Mullaney**. A fumble recovery that ended a Hawaii drive at the OSU 16, and long completions to **Victor Bolden** (40) and **Connor Hamlett** (37) set up the score.

Hamlett made it 14-0 at 6:15 with a 5-yard TD reception from Mannion. Ward's 35-yard run positioned the Beavers for the touchdown. OSU increased that lead to 21-0 at 13:30 of the second quarter on Ward's 32-yard TD run.

Hawaii parlayed an interception into a touchdown to cut OSU's lead to 21-7. But **Garrett Owens**' 27-yard field goal with 6:12 left in the half gave the Beavers a 24-7 lead and Ward scored on a 2-yard run with 1:31 remaining for a 31-7 intermission advantage.

"We were sharp and we did a lot of good things," OSU coach Mike Riley said of the first half, when OSU outgained Hawaii 348-111 and outrushed the Warriors 141-44.

Mannion's 7-yard TD pass to Bolden on the first possession of the second half made it 38-7. OSU then held on for its fourth straight win in the series it now leads 7-3. It will resume in Honolulu in 2019.

CORVALLIS — Tailbacks **Terron Ward** and **Storm Woods** each scored twice and Oregon State wore down San Diego State 28-7 before a crowd of 41,339 at Reser Stadium.

Senior quarterback **Sean Mannion** displaced former OSU star Derek Anderson (2001-04) in first place atop the school career passing yardage list on a 27-yard connection with **Hunter Jarmon** with 11:20 left in the third quarter that gave him 11,263 yards at that point. He also assumed third place on the all-time Pac-12 list on the same play.

Mannion completed 24 of 31 passes to 10 different receivers for 275 yards and increased his career total to 11,339 yards. USC's Matt Barkley is the all-time leader with 12,327 yards; USC's Carson Palmer is second at 11,818.

The Beavers did not need a 300-yard performance from Mannion on this night, however. Woods (11-52) and Ward (15-50) combined for 102 rushing yards and the defense completely stifled the Aztecs after surrendering a touchdown their opening drive.

Ward scored on runs of 12 and two yards, Woods on runs of five and two yards. **Steven Nelson** and **Michael Doctor** added interceptions and the Beavers had three sacks for 20 yards in losses. SDSU gained 75 yards on its first drive and then had just 140 the rest of the way.

"That was a good win," OSU coach **Mike Riley** said. "We had a speaker last night talk about perseverance and that came into play today."

"We had to stay with it because it didn't look very good early. There were some fantastic defensive plays after we got past that first drive."

"It was a hard game. We wanted to run the ball because we knew it would be hard if we had to pass protect all game."

SDSU had three sacks in the first quarter but none thereafter.

"Sean adjusted, we got rid of the ball quicker," Riley said. "We rushed for 10 times of the amount we had against them last year. Even though 100 yards isn't great we were pretty effective."

SDSU took a 7-0 lead with 11:27 left in the first quarter on a 2-yard scoring run by tailback Donnel Pumphrey. OSU replied with Ward's 12-yard run with five seconds left in the first quarter to even the score 7-7. Mannion's 32-yard hookup with Jarmon was the big play on the 70-yard drive.

Ward scored again on a 2-yard run with 27 seconds remaining in the first half to give the Beavers a 14-7 intermission lead. Mannion's 49-yard pass to **Rahmel Dockery** on the previous play positioned OSU for the go-ahead score.

Woods' 5-yard TD run made it 21-7 with 9:58 left in the third quarter. The record-setting pass to Jarmon set up the score. A 2-yard TD run by Woods made it 28-7 with 1:16 left in the third quarter and completed the scoring.



LOS ANGELES — Southern California scored the final 28 points of the game and the 22nd-ranked Trojans defeated Oregon State 28-10 at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum.

It was the first loss for the Beavers (3-1, 0-1 Pac-12), whose four-game winning streak over the past two seasons was snapped in their Pac-12 Conference opener.

Ryan Murphy's 97-yard kickoff return in the first quarter accounted for OSU's lone touchdown. **Trevor Romaine** added a 45-yard field goal that gave OSU a short-lived 10-7 advantage in the second quarter.

Senior quarterback **Sean Mannion** completed 15 of 32 passes for 123 yards. He was intercepted twice and remained tied with former USC star Carson Palmer for 13th on the Pac-12's all-time passing touchdown list with 72.

Junior tailback **Storm Woods** led OSU's ground attack with 61 yards on nine carries. Senior **Richard Mullaney** had a team-high five receptions for 78 yards.

The Trojans (3-1, 2-0 Pac-12) took a 7-0 lead on a 31-yard interception return by Su'a Cravens with 5:11 left in the first quarter. But Murphy returned the ensuing kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown to make it 7-7 after Romaine's PAT.

Romaine then sent the Beavers ahead 10-7 with a 45-yard field goal at 11:14 of the second quarter. USC surged in front to stay, 14-10, on Cody Kessler's 16-yard TC pass to Justin Davis with 7:16 left in the half.

The Trojans scored again on a 48-yard Kessler-to-Darreus Rogers Hail Mary pass on the final play of the first half to go ahead 21-10 and added a clinching score early in the fourth quarter.

BOULDER, Colo. — Senior tailback **Terron Ward** rushed for 102 yards and scored twice to spark a potent ground attack that powered Oregon State to a 36-31 win over Colorado at Folsom Field.

Ward scored OSU's opening touchdown on a 1-yard run in the first quarter and then added the clinching score on a 10-yard run with 5:09 remaining. After a Colorado score and an OSU punt, the Beavers stiffened defensively and stopped Colorado's final drive at the OSU 40-yard line with 1:48 remaining and then ran out the clock.

The win improved the Beavers to 4-1 overall and 1-1 in the Pac-12. The Buffaloes dropped to 2-4 overall, 0-3 in the Pac-12.

Ward needed just 12 carries to compile his second 100-yard game of the season and averaged 8.5 yards per carry. Junior tailback **Storm Woods** added 69 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries; the Beavers rushed for 189 yards on 27 carries, not including sacks.

"Our running game was outstanding," **Sean Mannion** said. "We pride ourselves on being balanced. Our offensive line has been great, not only in protection but in the run game. When you couple that with two good runners, it makes for a good unit."

Mannion completed 27 of 37 passes for 278 yards and a touchdown, with no interceptions.

Mannion also became the 24th quarterback in Pac-12 history with 1,000 or more completions with a 9-yard connection with **Richard Mullaney** in the first quarter. He now ranks 21st all-time with 1,023 completions.

OSU led 14-0 in the first quarter following short scoring runs by Ward and Woods. **Trevor Romaine** added 38- and 33-yard field goals but the Buffaloes rallied and took a 21-20 halftime lead with 43 second left before the break.

OSU took the lead for good, 23-21, on Romaine's 47-yard field goal with 6:47 to play in the third quarter. Mannion added a 24-yard TD pass and Ward's second TD in the fourth quarter stretched the lead to 36-24.

Tight ends **Connor Hamlett** (6-52) and Smith (4-67) combined for 10 receptions. **Victor Bolden** returned after missing the Sept. 27 USC game with a dislocated pinkie finger and had six catches for 38 yards and two runs for 18 more.



CORVALLIS — Quarterback **Sean Mannion** moved into second place on the Pac-12's all-time passing yardage list in a 29-23 double-overtime loss to No. 20 Utah before a crowd of 40,479 at Reser Stadium.

The Beavers tied the game 16-16 on **Trevor Romaine's** 49-yard field goal on the final play of regulation, and pulled even again at 23-23 on Mannion's 2-yard touchdown pass to **Jordan Villamin** on fourth down in the first overtime.

However, the Beavers missed a field goal in the second overtime and Utah's Devontae Booker scored on a 19-yard run to end the game. Mannion completed 21 of 37 passes for 272 yards and two touchdowns and supplanted former USC star Carson Palmer (1998-2002) on the Pac-12 career passing yardage list. Mannion now has 12,012 career yards and trails only Matt Barkley, who threw for 12,327 for USC from 2009-12.

Mannion passed Palmer on a 52-completion to **Victor Bolden** with 3:21 remaining in the third quarter. It was the longest reception of Bolden's career.

Utah led 9-6 through three quarters on the strength of three Andy Phillips field goals. However, on the third play of the fourth quarter, Mannion hit Villamin in stride down the left sideline and the redshirt freshman broke a tackle and dashed into the end zone with the go-ahead score.

The Utes went back ahead 16-13 with 4:06 remaining on Booker's 1-yard run on fourth-and-goal with 4:06 remaining. It completed a 94-yard, nine-play drive.

OSU then drove to the Utah 32 and called time out with two seconds to play. Romaine then made a 49-yard field goal — one yard shy of his all-time best — to force the second straight overtime game between the teams.

Each team then scored a touchdown in the first overtime.

The Beavers (4-2 overall, 1-2 Pac-12) were seeking their first win over a ranked opponent since a 27-20 triumph over No. 19 UCLA at the Rose Bowl on Sept. 22, 2012. However, Utah went to 5-1 overall and 2-1 in the Pac-12 with its first win in Corvallis since the 1991 season.

OSU also tied the game on the final play of the first half, when Romaine nailed a 45-yard field goal after twice being iced by Utah timeouts just before the snap for a 6-6 standoff. Earlier in the quarter he converted from 37 yards.

STANFORD, Calif. — Quarterback **Sean Mannion** moved closer to the Pac-12 Conference's career passing yardage record but the Beavers fell 38-14 to Stanford at Stanford Stadium.

Mannion completed 14 of 30 passes for 122 yards and remained in second place with 12,134 yards. He needs 194 more yards to pass career leader Matt Barkley of USC, who threw for 12,327 yards from 2009-12.

The Beavers (4-3 overall, 1-3 Pac-12) were held to 221 yards by the Cardinal (5-3, 3-2 Pac-12), who lead the conference in total defense. Stanford won its fifth straight game in the series.

Stanford took a 7-0 lead on its first possession and was marching for a second when safety **Ryan Murphy** grabbed his first interception of the season. Following an OSU punt, linebacker **Michael Doctor** returned another interception to the Stanford 5-yard line and tailback **Chris Brown** powered over on the next play for a 7-7 tie with 2:03 left in the first quarter.

However, Stanford scored the final 21 points of the first half to take a 28-7 intermission lead. The Cardinal added 10 more unanswered points in the second half before OSU tailback **Damien Haskins** scored on a 1-yard run with 3:54 to play on his first career carry for the final margin.

That touchdown was set up by quarterback **Luke Del Rio**'s 52-yard completion to **Hunter Jarmon**, a career-long for both players. Del Rio was 4-for-8 for 87 yards in his first meaningful game action.

Fullback **Ricky Ortiz** blocked a punt in the third quarter. It was OSU's first such play since Oct. 8, 2011, when Clayton York blocked a punt for a touchdown in a 37-27 victory at Reser Stadium.



CORVALLIS — Quarterback **Sean Mannion** set the Pac-12 Conference's career passing yardage record but California downed the Beavers 45-31 before a Homecoming crowd of 42,479 at Reser Stadium.

Mannion set the yardage record with 14:02 remaining in the game on a 15-yard completion to tight end **Connor Hamlett**. That gave him 12,334 yards, eclipsing the old record of 12,327, established by ex-USC star Matt Barkley from 2009-12.

Overall Mannion was 30-for-45 for 320 yards and two touchdowns, stretching his record total to 12,454 yards. He moved ahead of Keith Price (75) and Alex Brink (76) into 10th place on the Pac-12 career list with 77 touchdown passes.

The Beavers (4-4 overall, 1-4 Pac-12) exploded for 21 unanswered points in the third and fourth quarters to erase a 27-10 deficit. Tailback **Terron Ward**'s 16-yard run with 12:02 remaining.

However, the Bears (5-4 overall, 3-4 Pac-12) replied with 17 straight points in the final 8:42.

Tailback **Storm Woods** had a 49-yard run and gained 78 yards on nine carries. Ward added 53 yards and a touchdown on eight carries.

Wide receiver **Victor Bolden** matched his career high with 11 receptions for 119 yards. Wide receiver **Jordan Villamin** established career highs for catches (9) and yards (140) and a touchdown.

Cal led 3-0 after one quarter on a 41-yard field goal by James Langford with 1:19 left in the period. He also missed a 50-yarder on Cal's opening possession.

Oregon State went ahead briefly, 7-3, on Mannion's 3-yard touchdown pass to **Rahmel Dockery** early in the second quarter. But Cal bracketed **Trevor Romaine**'s 30-yard field goal with 14- and 21-yard TD runs by Daniel Lasco and added Langford's 26-yard field goal with 14 seconds left for a 20-10 intermission lead.

CORVALLIS — Quarterback Sean Mannion threw for 419 yards but Oregon State fell 39-32 to Washington State before a Dad's Weekend crowd of 44,377 at Reser Stadium.

The Cougars (3-7, 2-5 Pac-12) scored twice in the fourth quarter to erase a 25-24 deficit for their first victory at Reser Stadium since 2006. The Beavers (4-5, 1-5) had won 7 of the previous 8 games in the series.

Mannion was 31-for-41 for one touchdown without an interception and increased his Pac-12 career mark to 12,873 yards. He also assumed sole possession of ninth on the Pac-12 career list with 78 touchdown passes.

Freshman placekicker **Garrett Owens** was 4-for-4 on field goals (24, 37, 44, 46) in his third career start. His 46-yarder was a career-long.

The Beavers rallied from a 24-16 second-half deficit to take a 25-24 on Owens' 47-yard field goal with 14:15 to play, but they couldn't hold the Cougars off.

OSU jumped to a 10-0 first-quarter lead on Mannion's 14-yard TD pass to **Connor Hamlett** and a 24-yard field goal by Owens. The Cougars rallied behind three Luke Falk touchdown passes that offset two more Owens' field goals, and took a 21-16 halftime advantage.

WSU stretched its lead to 24-16 on a field goal before the Beavers mounted their comeback. **Terron Ward's** 1-yard TD run with 6:41 left in the third quarter brought OSU to within 24-22.

The Cougars answered again on another Falk TD pass and a two-point conversion to surge ahead 32-25 with 11:01 remaining. Falk's fifth TD pass, with 5:07 remaining, made it 39-25 and offset Terron Ward's TD with 3:00 to play that trimmed the lead to 39-32.

The Beavers never got the ball back, however, as WSU got two first downs and ran out the clock. Falk was 44-for-61 for 471 yards and five touchdowns in his first career start.

CORVALLIS — Quarterback **Sean Mannion** threw two second-half touchdown passes and **Michael Doctor** returned an interception 35 yards for the clinching score as Oregon State upended No. 6 Arizona State 35-27 at Reser Stadium.

It was OSU's (5-5, 2-5 Pac-12) first victory over a ranked team since a 27-20 win over UCLA at the Rose Bowl on Sept. 22, 2012. OSU's last win over a top-10 team was a 29-27 upset of No. 9 Arizona on Oct. 9, 2010; its last home win over a top-10 team was a 27-21 victory over No. 1 USC on Sept. 25, 2008.

Senior linebacker **D.J. Alexander** sacked ASU quarterback Taylor Kelly for a 13-yard loss on a 4th-and-2 from the ASU 33-yard line with 1:10 to play to end ASU's final drive. OSU took three knees to end the game and thousands in the crowd of 40,525 stormed the field.

Senior **Terron Ward** (148) and junior **Storm Woods** (125) combined for 273 rushing yards and established career-bests for their longest run as the Beavers pounded out 247 yards rushing and 498 yards of total offense. The last time two Beavers rushed for 100 yards in the same game was in the 2007 Emerald Bowl against Maryland, when Yvenson Bernard (177) and James Rodgers (115) combined for 292.

Mannion completed 19 of 33 passes for 251 yards and two touchdowns and engineered two second-half scoring drives that erased a 24-14 ASU lead. The Beavers scored 21 of the final 24 points of the game to snap a four-game losing streak.

OSU started quickly as Woods broke free for a 78-yard TD run up the middle on their second snap to give the Beavers a 7-0 lead with 11:17 left in the first quarter. It was their longest run from scrimmage since the 2002 season and their longest play from scrimmage this season.

After an ASU field goal, Ward broke free on a play similar to Woods' and scampered 66 yards for another touchdown with 5:09 left in the quarter. It was also the longest run of his career.

The Sun Devils responded with 21 unanswered points on two Kelly TD passes and a fumble return to surge ahead 24-14 at halftime.

Mannion's 20-yard TD pass to **Victor Bolden** drew the Beavers within 24-21 with 5:50 left in the third quarter. Another ASU field goal made it 27-21 with 12:43 to play.

Mannion then sent the Beavers ahead 28-27 with a 67-yard scoring strike to Jordan Villamin with 10:55 to play. He set the school record of 80 TD passes on that play, breaking a tie with Derek Anderson.
