Oregon State (3-0) vs. Oklahoma State (4-0)

November 24, 2014 • 5:30 p.m. PT • MGM Grand Garden Arena • Las Vegas, Nev.

THE GAME: Oregon State and Oklahoma State will open the MGM Grand Main Event Heavyweight bracket at 5:30 p.m. on Monday in Las Vegas. Auburn and Tulsa will face each other in the other Heavyweight bracket game at approximately 8 p.m.

QUICKLY: Oregon State 3-0 for just the second time since 2000 (2011 was the other) ... The Beavers held Oral Roberts to 20.9 percent (9-43) shooting, the lowest by an opponent since Jan. 2, 1993 when UC San Diego shot 19.7 percent (14-71) ... Oregon State held Oral Roberts to 42 points, the lowest by an opponent since Feb. 6, 2010 when the Beavers defeated Oregon, 62-42 ... The Beavers are second in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (52.7) and field goal percentage defense (.304) ... Malcolm Duvivier (17), Jarmal Reid (17), Langston Morris-Walker (16), Olaf Schaftenaar (12) and Cheikh N'diaye (8) have all set career highs for points this season ... Guard Gary Payton II leads the Beavers in rebounding (7.0) and blocked shots (2.7) ... Five different players have led or shared scoring honors in games this season ... Oregon State is outscoring its opponents 122-32 in the paint and 24-4 on fast break points.

vs. OKLAHOMA STATE: Oregon State and Oklahoma State have played six previous times with the Beavers holding a 5-1 advantage. The teams first met in the 1949 NCAA West Semifinals in Kansas City, Mo., when Oklahoma State, then called Oklahoma A&M, won the game to earn a trip to the national championship. Despite falling in that contest, the Beavers advanced to the Final Four for the first time in school history where they lost to Illinois in the third-place game in Seattle, Wash.

The teams met for the second time at the Sun Devil Tournament in Phoenix, Ariz., in 1967 with the Beavers coming out on top, 49-48. They played a four-game home-and-home series in 1970 and 1971 when Oregon State won all four contests.

AT MGM GRAND GARDEN ARENA: Oregon State has played three previous times at the MGM Grand Garden Arena, including the first-ever basketball game played there, when the Beavers defeated San Diego, 86-79, on Dec. 22, 2012. The other two times came in the Pac-12 Tournament when Oregon State lost in the first round to Colorado (74-68 on March 13, 2013) and Oregon (88-74 on March 12, 2014).

THE ROSTER: Here are some quick-hitters about the 2014-15 Oregon State men's basketball team:

- The 16-man roster includes 10 scholarship players and six walk-ons.
- All six walk-ons are from the State of Oregon.
- The roster doesn't include a senior. Since 1950, the only other times Oregon State didn't have a senior were 1978-79 and 2003-04 when those teams went 18-10 and 12-16, respectively.
- Alex Roth, who redshirted last season after walking-on, is yet to play this season with a shoulder injury.
- Justin Stangel, a practice player last season, was awarded a scholarship for his hard work during the summer.
- AJ Hedgecock, Dylan Livesay, Matt Dahlen, Bryan Boswell and Tanner Sanders were all added to the official roster after the team held open tryouts on Oct. 4. A total of 22 Oregon State students participated in the open tryouts. Sanders also plays on the Oregon State football team as a scout player.
- Four players competed in all 32 games last season and two of them are returning: Malcolm Duvivier and Daniel Gomis.
- Four returners started a combined 32 games last season. They are Langston Morris-Walker (17), Victor Robbins (11), Daniel Gomis (2) and Jarmal Reid (2).
- Returning statistical leaders from last season include:
 - Points: Langston Morris-Walker -- 3.97
 - Rebounds: Daniel Gomis -- 2.53
 - Assists: Victor Robbins -- 0.78
 - Blocked Shots: Daniel Gomis -- 0.97
 - Steals: Victor Robbins -- 0.48
- The returners entered the season with a combined eight double-figure scoring games and one double-figure rebounding game.
- Daniel Gomis has been at Oregon State longer than anyone on the roster. He missed the 2011-12 season after breaking his leg, redshirted the 2012-13 season after having surgery on that leg and played his redshirt sophomore season in 2013-14. Head coach Wayne Tinkle refers to him as "pops."
- Gary Payton II and Justin Stangel's fathers both played basketball at Oregon State. The elder Payton was a consensus All-American and still holds the school records for career points, assists and steals. Justin's father, Jamie, played in 1980, '82, '83 and '84 (the Beavers won the Pac-10 title three of those years). Payton II will wear No. 1 (his father's No. 20 is retired) and Justin will wear the same number his father wore at Oregon State, No. 40.
- Olaf Schatenaar's brother, Roeland, played basketball for Oregon State from 2007-10 and was Most Valuable Player at the 2009 College Basketball Invitational when the Beavers won the CBI championship.
- Matt Dahlen and Tanner Sander's fathers both played football for Oregon State. Chris Dahlen played for the Beavers from 1982-86 and Scott Sanders played from 1986-89.

WHAT'S MISSING: Here are some quick-hitters about what Oregon State will be missing this season with the departures of players graduating, transferring or leaving early to play professionally:

- Angus Brandt, Devon Collier and Roberto Nelson graduated, Challe Barton and Eric Moreland left after their junior seasons to play professionally, and Hallice Cooke transferred to Iowa State after his freshman campaign.
- Those six players had combined career totals of: 5,284 points, 2,328 rebounds, 915 assists, 400 blocked shots, 403 steals, 247 double-figure scoring games, 55 double-figure rebounding games, 35 double-doubles and 591 games played.
- On Oregon State's career lists, Roberto Nelson is fourth all-time in scoring (1,745), Devon Collier is seventh all-time in scoring (1,489), eighth in rebounds (679) and third in blocked shots (134), and Eric Moreland is the all-time leader in blocked shots (184) and fifth all-time in rebounds (762).
- Last season, Roberto Nelson was selected to the All-Pac-12 Second Team, Eric Moreland was named Pac-12 All-Defensive Honorable Mention and Hallice Cooke was named Pac-12 All-Freshmen Honorable Mention.
- Last season, Roberto Nelson led the Pac-12 in scoring, Devon Collier led the league in field goal percentage and Hallice Cooke finished second in the conference in three-point percentage.
- Angus Brandt was a three-time team captain and received Pac-12 All-Academic recognition four times.

THE COACHING STAFF: Here are some quick-hitters about the new Oregon State men's basketball coaching staff:

- The coaching staff of head coach Wayne Tinkle, associate head coach Kerry Rupp, and assistant coaches Gregg Gottlieb and Stephen Thompson have a combined 58 years coaching experience at the college level.
- The staff has earned a combined 14 NCAA Tournament berths.
- Rupp was the head coach at Louisiana Tech from 2007-11 and Thompson was the head coach at Cal State L.A. from 2005-14.
- Gottlieb is the Pac-12's longest-tenured assistant coach after spending the past seven seasons at California.

RECRUITING CLASS: The 2015 class includes Derrick Bruce, a 6-foot-3, 165-pound guard from Orlando, Fla.; Drew Eubanks, a 6-foot-10, 225-pound forward from Troutdale, Ore.; Gligorije Rakocevic, a 6-foot-10, 245-pound center from Bijelo Polj, Montenegro; Stephen Thompson, Jr., a 6-foot-3, 165-pound guard from Torrance, Calif., and Tres Tinkle, a 6-foot-7, 215-pound forward from Missoula, Mont.

- The class is ranked 15th in the nation by 247Sports.com and 18th in the nation by Rivals.com, the highest-ever recruiting class rankings in school history.
- Bruce is a three-star guard and ranked 124th overall on Rivals 150.
- Eubanks is a four-star forward and the top-ranked 2015 player in the State of Oregon by ESPN.
- Rakocevic is a three-star center according to Rivals and 247Sports.
- Thompson Jr., is a four-star guard and ranked 69th on the ESPN 100.
- Tres Tinkle is a four-star forward and No. 77 on ESPN's Top 100.

QUICK LOOK AT LANGSTON: Langston Morris-Walker is Oregon State's top returning scorer at 4.0 points per game and has stepped up as the leader of the team. He represented Oregon State at Pac-12 Media Day and also participated in a Beavers Without Borders service trip to the Dominican Republic. LMW posted his first career double-double in the opener with 11 points and 10 boards, and scored a career-high 16 points against Corban.

QUICK LOOK AT MALCOLM: Malcolm Duvivier has scored in double figures in two of his last six games dating back to last season. He scored 13 points against Arizona State in the regular-season finale and opened this season with a career-high 17 points against Rice. He knocked down 5-of-8 three-point shots in those two contests; he has made a total of 12 triples in his other 33 career games.

QUICK LOOK AT OLAF: The coaching staff has worked with Olaf Schaftenaar to be more of an offensive force inside the three-point line. In his first two seasons, Schaftenaar put up 167 shots with 136 of those coming from beyond the arc. He has taken 15 shots this season, with only six of them coming from deep, and his field goal percentage is 60.0 percent (9-for-15). Coming into this season, his career percentage was 32.9 percent (55-for-167).

QUICK LOOK AT CHEIKH: After playing only 71 minutes last season, Cheikh N'diaye started the first three games and has already notched 42 minutes. He had his best game as Beaver against Oral Roberts, posting career highs with eight points and six rebounds.

QUICK LOOK AT GP2: Gary Payton II got his first career points on a two-handed dunk in the first half against Rice. He finished the game with six points, nine rebounds, two assists, three blocked shots and two steals. His dad, the legendary Gary Payton, scored his first career points on a three-pointer at UTEP on Nov. 29, 1986. He finished that game with 16 points, five assists, four rebounds and two steals.

QUICK LOOK AT GOMIS: Daniel Gomis missed the first game but returned against Corban and finished with four points and four rebounds in nine minutes. He played all 32 games last season after missing the previous two years with a broken leg.

QUICK LOOK AT JARMAL: Jarmal Reid had by far the best game of his career in the season opener when he came off the bench to score a career-high 17 points by going 8-for-12 from the field. His previous career high was seven points as a freshman at Howard on Dec. 19, 2012. In 26 games last season, the most points he scored was four and he went scoreless in 14 of them.

QUICK LOOK AT VICTOR: Victor Robbins also played well coming off the bench in the first three games, as he made two key shots and grabbed a career-high eight rebounds against Rice, with four of them on the offensive glass. He switched his number from 1 to 4 this season and says that is the key to his new confidence.

PLAYING PROFESSIONALLY: Seven Oregon State players who competed for the Beavers over the past three seasons are playing professionally, including two in the NBA. It's the first time two Oregon State players have been in the NBA at the same time since 2006-07, when Gary Payton played his final season with the Miami Heat and Brent Barry helped the San Antonio Spurs win the NBA title.

25th ANNIVERSARY: This is the 25th anniversary of Gary Payton being named Sports Illustrated National Player of the Year. The Glove averaged 25.7 points, 4.7 rebounds, 8.1 assists and 3.5 steals that season, and led the Beavers to the NCAA Tournament, the last time OSU has been there.

PAUL VALENTI TRIBUTE: Every home ticket this season will feature an image of Paul Valenti, an Oregon State athlete, coach, administrator and goodwill ambassador for more than 70 years, who passed away this past September. The team and coaching staff are wearing a PV patch on their jerseys and suits in honor of the Oregon State legend who played basketball at Oregon State from 1940-42, was an assistant coach for the Beavers for 19 years and the head coach for six seasons.

GIVE & GO FEATURES: There were Q&A's done with six Oregon State basketball players recently and here are some of their quotes (the full Q&A's can be read on osubeavers.com):

Malcolm Duvivier: "I learned so much from Roberto Nelson. On offense he taught me all the little things that he did to be able to score. He was a great teacher. Guarding one of the best scorers ever every day was a big challenge. I'm starting to implement what he taught me into my game to become a better scorer."

Daniel Gomis: "I am always trying to get everything in the positive side. I came here and had some adversity to deal with some broken legs but I always tried to keep it positive. No matter how hard things are there are people who have it way tougher than you."

Langston Morris-Walker: "I didn't really show what I can do to the world, because I was more of a role player. Everybody coming back, we haven't really shown anybody what we can do. I feel we can be a good team. No one knows us. People are always quick to judge us because our group hasn't really accomplished anything, but they don't know what we can do."

Gary Payton II: "We didn't think the Mitten fit for me (as a nickname) because I'm not going to be a replica of my dad and what he did. So we don't know what we're going to go with. Everybody has been using G2. We'll see. But no Mitten."

Victor Robbins: "You just can't give up when your back is against the wall because it's going to happen plenty of times. It's going to happen plenty of times this season. We just have to stay together. We just have to keep it pushing forward."

Olaf Schaftenaar: "It's the role I was in my first two years; I was used as a shooter, to take a bunch of shots. If they go in, that's nice. That was my role. This year it's going to be a lot different. I'm going to be more of an inside presence, not just scoring, but make defenses collapse. I think I'm a pretty good passer and I can get my teammates the ball that way."

WAYNE TINKLE

Head Coach 1st Year Montana, 2005

Wayne Tinkle, who led Montana to three NCAA Tournament appearances, has been named the head coach of the Oregon State men's basketball team, Director of Athletics Bob De Carolis announced on May 19, 2014.

Tinkle, 48, was the head coach at Montana for eight seasons and won 158 games, the second most in school history. He led the Grizzlies to Big Sky regular-season titles in 2010, 2012 and 2013 and Big Sky Tournament championships in 2012 and 2013. His 97 conference wins are the most by any Montana coach.

"Today, with the hiring of Coach Wayne Tinkle, Oregon State University begins a new era in Beaver men's basketball of regularly competing within the top echelon of the Pac-12 for the conference championship and for postseason NCAA competition," De Carolis said.

"The more I went through the process, the more recommendations I received about Coach Tinkle," De Carolis added. "I met with Coach Tinkle for several hours last week and came away very impressed with him. His success on the basketball court as a coach and player is well documented, but even more so, I was impressed with his demeanor, family and philosophy. I think he is a perfect fit for our basketball program, Oregon State University, the community and this state."

Tinkle led Montana to four consecutive postseason trips from 2010-13, including the NCAA Tournament in 2010, 2012 and 2013. He also went to the "Big Dance" three times during his five years as an assistant with the Grizzlies. He was named the Big Sky Coach of the Year after the 2011-12 and 2012-13 seasons and the NABC Division I All-District 6 Coach of the Year in 2012.

His Montana teams went 25-7 in both 2011-12 and 2012-13, the second most wins in a season in school history. The Grizzlies had a stretch with 25 consecutive Big Sky victories and set a conference record with 19 league wins in 2012-13.

Montana had winning records in seven of Tinkle's eight years as head coach and won 20 or more games in four consecutive seasons (2010-13). He is the only coach in Montana history to lead his teams to the NCAA Tournament three times and be named the Big Sky Coach of the Year twice.

He served as an assistant coach for Don Holst, Pat Kennedy and Larry Krystkowiak, who is currently the head coach at the University of Utah. Other coaches who worked at Montana that went on to outstanding college coaching careers include Jud Heathcote and Mike Montgomery.

Tinkle was a standout forward for the Grizzlies from 1986-89 and a three-time All-Big Sky pick his sophomore, junior and senior seasons. He is fourth all-time at Montana in rebounds (836) and sixth in points (1,500). He was Montana's Carl Dragstedt Award (MVP) winner in 1988 and 1989, and led the team in rebounding in 1987, 1988 and 1989, and in scoring in 1988 and 1989.

He played professionally for 12 years with stints in the CBA and in Sweden, Spain, Italy and Greece.

Tinkle, the 21st head coach in Beaver basketball history, earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Montana in health and human performance in 2005.

He was born on Jan. 26, 1966 in Milwaukee, Wis., as the youngest of 11 children (seven girls and four boys). He graduated from Ferris High School in Spokane, Wash., in 1984.

Tinkle is married to the former Lisa McLeod, who was a standout basketball player at Montana and was inducted into the Grizzly Sports Hall of Fame in 2011. They have two daughters, Joslyn and Elleson, and one son, Tres. Joslyn played in three basketball Final Fours during her four-year career at Stanford and Elleson just finished her sophomore basketball season at Gonzaga. Tres is a standout forward at Missoula's Hellgate High School.
