Series: first meeting

THE GAME

Weber State kicks off the 2015 college football season Friday, Sept. 4 at Oregon State in Corvallis, Ore. The game will begin at 5 p.m. Pacific time (6 p.m. MDT) and will be televised nationally on the Pac-12 Network.

FIRST AND 10

- Weber State begins its 54th season of Division I football.
- Friday's game will be the third ever game for Weber State against a team from the Pac-12 Conference and just the sixth game against a team from a Power 5 conference. However, it will be the third straight year against a Pac-12 team.
- Weber State returns 15 starters and 38 letterwinners off last year's team but has just 11 seniors on the roster and just three seniors on the offensive side of the ball.
- WSU head coach Jay Hill returns for his second season as head coach of the Wildcats. Hill was an assistant coach at the University of Utah for 13 seasons before taking the helm with the Wildcats last season.
- Oregon State is coached by Gary Andersen who is in his first year with the Beavers but is a former head coach at Southern Utah, Utah State and Wisconsin and a longtime assistant at Utah.
- Andersen and Hill have a long connection beginning when Andersen recruited Hill to play at Utah. The two also coached together for five seasons at Utah.
- Oregon State is the only team in the nation without a quarterback that has playing experience. OSU also has just 13 seniors on the roster.
- The Wildcats open the season with three of their first four games on the road. WSU plays at four-time FCS national champion North Dakota State next Saturday.

WEBER STATE FOOTBALL HISTORY

Weber State began playing Division I football in 1962 and one year later, became a charter member of the Big Sky Conference. WSU has captured three Big Sky titles and advanced to the FCS Playoffs four times in school history. Weber State's list of legendary head coaches includes Sark Arslanian, Mike Price, Dave Arslanian and Ron McBride.

The 'Cats have had 50 players earn All-American honors and have had 37 players drafted in the NFL. Former WSU quarterback Jamie Martin won the 1991 Walter Payton Trophy and then had a long career in the NFL. Several other Wildcats have also played in the NFL, including Paul McQuistan who won a Super Bowl ring last season with the Seattle Seahawks.

WEBER STATE OPENS THE 2015 SEASON

Weber State begins its 54th season of Division I football this Friday night when the Wildcats travel to Corvallis, Ore., to take on Oregon State. WSU is coming off a 2-10 overall record in 2014 and a 2-6 finish in Big Sky Conference play. The 'Cats return 38 letterwinners and 15 starters off last year's squad.

JAY HILL RETURNS AS WILDCAT HEAD COACH



Jay Hill returns for his second season as head coach of the Wildcats. Hill was named the 11th head coach in Weber State history in December 2013. Prior to coming to Weber State, he spent 13 years as an assistant coach at the University of Utah where he worked under legendary coaches Urban Meyer, Ron McBride and Kyle Whittingham.

RETURNING WILDCATS

The Wildcats return 38 letterwinners and 15 starters off last year's team. WSU has four players returning that earned Big Sky All-Conference honors last year.

Junior safety Josh Burton earned All-Big Sky honors last year. He started all 12 games for the Wildcats and had three interceptions, sixth most in the Big Sky. He was also 10th in the league in pass deflections. Burton, a native of Roseland, La., has played in 24 games in his career at Weber State.

Senior center Joe Hawkins earned honorable mention All-Big Sky honors last year. Hawkins has played in 33 career games on the offensive line for the Wildcats and has started the last 32 games. Hawkins is a native of Vero Beach, Fla.

Junior wide receiver Cameron Livingston returns after also earned honorable mention All-Big Sky honor last season. The Ocala, Fla., native started in all 12 games and had 57 catches for 856 yards and one touchdown. In 24 career games he has 1,200 career receiving yards with five touchdowns.

Sophomore Emmett Tela earned All-Conference honors as a true freshman linebacker last season. The Provo, Utah native played in eight games and had 79 tackles with 10 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks.

WILDCAT EXPERIENCE

Weber State has 11 seniors on this year's squad, including only three seniors on the offensive side of the ball. All three seniors on the offensive line.

The Wildcats have 29 juniors, 19 sophomores, eight red shirt freshmen and 23 true freshmen.

OFFENSE

The Wildcats return eight starters and 19 letterwinners on offense, but have just three seniors on the offensive side of the ball.

Junior quarterback Jadrian Clark is projected as the starting quarterback for the Wildcats. Clark played in six games and started in four games last season for the Wildcats and threw for 902 yards and seven touchdowns. Sophomore Erik Wilkes and junior Zach Smith return at running back. Smith has played in 23 games and has rushed for 1,026 career yards with the Wildcats, and ranks 28th in rushing in school history. Cameron Livingston, Drew Batchelor and Darryl Denby are among the returners at wide receiver. Joe Hawkins, Cameron Young, A.J. Wilcox and Shane Oliverson are among the returners on the offensive line.

DEFENSE

On defense the Wildcats have six starters and 17 returning letterwinners on defense. Junior safety Josh Burton returns after earning Big Sky All-Conference honors last season. Senior Cordero Dixon is also back in the secondary along with senior Devonte Johnson, sophomore Taron Johnson and sophomore Mitch Tulane. Junior Tre'veon Johnson returns at linebacker along with Emmett Tela and sophomore Alema Key. Nebraska transfer Jared Afalava joins the linebacker group. Senior Jonathan Carlson and junior Jake Gallegos are among the returners on the defensive line.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Senior punter and kicker Josh Kealamakia returns for another year with the Wildcats. Kealamakia has played in 33 career games at Weber State and ranks ninth in WSU history in career punting.

Wednesday Coaches Call

Each Wednesday all head coaches in the Big Sky will participate in a conference call with the media. **Coach Hill will talk at 10:24 a.m. each Wednesday.** Contact Paul Grua at Weber State or Jon Kasper at the Big Sky Conference for conference call information and telephone number.

COACHING CONNECTIONS

This will be the first ever meeting between Weber State and Oregon State but the two teams have lots of connections on the coaching staff.

OSU head coach Gary Andersen is in his first year with the Beavers. He is a former head coach at Southern Utah, Utah State and Wisconsin and was a longtime assistant coach at Utah. Andersen recruited WSU head coach Jay Hill to play at Utah, then the two spent five years coaching together with the Utes.

Hill also coached with Kalani Sitake, OSU's defensive coordinator, for eight years at Utah. Sitake is the brother of WSU passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach Fesi Sitake.

Oregon State also has two assistant coaches who have spent time as assistant coaches at Weber State. OSU quarterbacks coach Kevin McGiven spent three seasons (2006-08) as the offensive coordinator at Weber State. Chad Kauha'aha'a is Oregon State's defensive line coach. He spent four seasons (2005-08) as an assistant coach at Weber State. Both McGiven and Kauha'aha'a were on the WSU staff that won the 2008 Big Sky title.

In addition, new WSU assistant coach Cory Hall coached under Andersen at Wisconsin and briefly at Oregon State. WSU linebackers coach Lance Hunsaker was a graduate assistant coach under Andersen at Utah and WSU defensive ends coach Jason Kaufusi played for Andersen at Utah.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Coach Hill has named five team captains for the 2015 season. The team captains are: junior safety **Josh Burton**, senior center **Joe Hawkins**, senior cornerback **Devonte Johnson**, junior linebacker **Tre'veon Johnson** and junior wide receiver **Cameron Livingston**. The five players have combined to play in 115 games at Weber State.

WSU AGAINST FBS TEAMS

Friday's game will mark just the fifth time in school history that Weber State has played a team from a Power 5 conference. The 'Cats played Arkansas in 2001, faced Boston College and Texas Tech in 2010, played Utah in 2013 and played at Arizona State last season. It is the third straight year against a team from the Pac-12 Conference.

Weber State is just 3-51 all-time against FBS teams. WSU beat Utah State in 1978 and beat Nevada twice (1992 and 1993), the first two years Nevada was playing at the Division I-A level.

AROUND THE BIG SKY

The Big Sky Conference already has a game under its belt before the rest of the college football season begins. On Saturday, Montana upset No. 1 ranked North Dakota State 38-35 in Missoula in the first game in the country.

There are 12 Big Sky games this weekend with five games seeing Big Sky teams facing FBS opponents and three against the Pac-12. In addition to Weber State, Portland State plays at Washington and Eastern Washington plays at Oregon.

Weber State was picked to finish 10th in the conference race in the preseason media poll and was picked 11th in the coaches poll.

WILDCATS COME FROM ALL OVER

Weber State's roster this season includes players from 11 different states. A total of 36 players on the roster come from the state of Utah. The 'Cats have 19 players from the state of California, seven from Idaho and six from Florida. WSU also boasts players from Nevada (4), Washington (4), Arizona (3), Colorado (3), Texas (3), Louisiana (2) and Minnesota (2). WSU also has one player from Australia.

LOOKING AHEAD

After Friday's game the Wildcats will be back on the road at North Dakota State, Sept. 12 in Fargo, N.D. The Bison are the four-time defending FCS National champions. They opened their season ranked first in the country but lost a 38-35 season opener at Montana.

After that, Weber State's home opener will be Sept. 19 against Sacramento State which will also be the annual Homecoming game at Weber State.

GAME 1 - AT OREGON STATE

ABOUT OREGON STATE



The Oregon State Beavers come into the 2015 season with a new head coach and lots of changes on the roster. The Beavers finished 2014 with a 5-7 overall record and were 2-7 in Pac-12 play, finishing in a tie for fifth in the north division.

This season OSU has 40 returning letterwinners and 12 returning starters. On offense the Beavers have nine starters returning, including all five players on the offensive line. Senior tailback Storm Barrs-Woods has rushed for 2,183 yards in his career and is on the verge of becoming the second Beaver in school history with 2,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards.

However, Oregon State does not have a quarterback returning that has playing experience. OSU is the only team in the nation that has no quarterbacks with experience and has only eligible freshmen quarterbacks.

The Beavers have just two starters returning on defense.

Oregon State is one of the most inexperienced teams in the nation with just 13 seniors on the active roster, the youngest in the Pac-12 and the ninth youngest in the nation.

HEAD COACH GARY ANDERSEN

The Beavers are coached by Gary Andersen who is in his first season as head coach at OSU. This will be his eighth season as head coach and has compiled a record of 49-38.

Andersen spent the last two seasons as head coach at Wisconsin where he compiled a 19-7 overall record with the Badgers. Prior to that he spent four seasons as head coach at Utah State, posting a 26-24 overall record, including an 11-2 mark in 2012. Andersen was also the head coach at Southern Utah in 2003. He spent 11

seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Utah, including four seasons as the defensive coordinator.

Andersen is a native of Salt Lake City and graduated from Utah in 1986. He also has ties to the Big Sky Conference having spent time as an assistant coach at Idaho State and Northern Arizona.

SERIES HISTORY

This will be the first meeting ever between the two schools. It will also mark just the third game ever for Weber State against a team from the Pac-12 conference. WSU played at Arizona State last season and at Utah in 2013. The Wildcats have games scheduled at Cal in 2017 and at Utah in 2018.

Oregon State is 21-4-2 against teams currently in the Big Sky. This is the third straight-year and the fourth time in the last five years that the Beavers have opened the season against a team from the Big Sky. They are also scheduled to play Big Sky teams in each of the next three seasons.

The Beavers have lost two games in recent years to Big Sky schools, falling to Sacramento State in 2011 and Eastern Washington in 2013.

WSU HEAD COACH JAY HILL



JAY HILL

**Head Coach
Second Season**



Jay Hill enters his second season as head coach of the Weber State football team. He was named the 11th head coach in Weber State football history in December 2013.

In his first season as head coach he guided the Wildcats to a 2-10 overall record and a 2-6 mark in Big Sky play. Under his direction, Weber State saw dramatic improvements statistically and finished the season in the top third in the Big Sky in several categories. He also coached 11 Wildcats that earned Big Sky All-Conference honors.

Hill, a longtime assistant coach at the University of Utah, came to WSU with a reputation as one of the top recruiters in the West and has spent time working for three different head coaches at Utah.

Hill, 40, spent 13 years at Utah, including the last nine seasons as a full-time assistant coach under Kyle Whittingham. Prior to that, he spent four years as a graduate assistant and administrative assistant with the Utes under legendary coaches Ron McBride and Urban Meyer.

The Lehi, Utah native played college football at Ricks Junior College, where he earned junior college All-American honors at cornerback. He went on to play two seasons (1998-99) at Utah under Ron McBride. As a senior he led the Mountain West in interceptions, was named Utah's Defensive MVP and earned second team All-Conference honors. He later played briefly in the XFL and signed free agent contracts with the Buffalo Bills and New York Giants.

After his playing career, he spent three seasons as a graduate assistant coach and one year as an administrative assistant, working for McBride and Meyer.

In 2005, he became a full-time assistant coach under Whittingham. All nine seasons he spent at Utah he worked as the special teams coordinator. He also coached on offense and defense, coaching the cornerbacks (2005-06; 2010-11), running backs (2012) and tight ends (2007-09; 2013).

Utah's special teams excelled under Hill. In 2006, the Utes led the nation in net punting. They led the Mountain West in kickoff coverage four straight seasons and led the Pac-12 in the category in 2011, Utah's first year in the conference. In 2012 Utah was sixth in the nation in kick return average and this past season the Utes again led the Pac-12 in net punting and finished 10th in the nation. In 2008 Hill was a finalist for the FootballScoop Special Teams Coordinator of the Year.

In his career at Utah, Hill served as the position coach for five All-Americans: defensive back Eric Weddle in 2006, punter Louie Sakoda in 2007, Sakoda as a place kicker in 2008, punt returner

Shaky Smithson in 2010 and kick returner Reggie Dunn in 2012. Weddle was drafted in the second round of the 2007 NFL Draft by the San Diego Chargers and is a Pro Bowl safety. Sakoda, the only unanimous consensus All-American in Utah football history, was a Lou Groza and Ray Guy finalist in 2008. Smithson led the nation in punt returns yards and average in 2010. Hill also mentored NFL draft picks Sean Smith, Brice McCain, R.J. Stanford and Brandon Burton.

During his tenure with the Utes, Hill became acclaimed as a top recruiter. Rivals.com named him to its "Class of 2009 Top 25 Recruiters" and named him one of the Top 10 Recruiters in the Pac-12 in 2012.

Hill earned a bachelor's degree in Spanish in 2000 from Utah and earned his master's degree in ESS/Sports Psychology in 2005.

He and his wife Sara have four children: Ashtyn, Alayna, Allie and Jacob.
