> No. 20/23 Utah (4-1, 1-1 Pac-12) plays Oregon State (4-1, 1-1) on Thursday, Oct. 16 in Corvallis, Ore. The game will kick off at 7:00 p.m. PT/8:00 p.m. MT in Reser Stadium and will be televised on FOX Sports 2, as well as KMYU in Salt Lake City. Radio is ESPN700 AM and Sirius 91/XM 91.

> The Utah-OSU football game originally scheduled for a FOX Sports 1 national telecast has been moved to FOX Sports 2 (DirectTV channel 618; Dish channel 397) to accommodate game five of MLB's National League Championship Series. The Ute game will also be aired on KMYU in Salt Lake City, found on Comcast channel 643 (HD)/22 (SD) and satellite channel 12.

> In the latest rankings, Utah moved up four places in the A.P. poll to No. 20 and cracked the *USA Today* Coaches' poll for the first time since 2010 at No. 23. It is Utah's highest A.P. ranking since Dec. 22, 2010 and its best Coaches' ranking since the final poll of 2010. See page 16 for Utah's ranking history.

> Utah is off to its best start since winning its first eight games in 2010. Its 1-1 conference start is its best since joining the Pac-12 in 2011.

> Even with a bye last week, Utah leads the nation in total sacks (28) and sacks per game (5.6) for the second-straight week. Utah also leads the country in tackles for loss per game (10.2) and is third in total TFL (51). **Nate Orchard** ranks No. 1 nationally in sacks per game (1.7) and is second in total sacks (8.5).

> Utah's first victory over a Pac-12 team as a conference member was against Oregon State in 2011. Utah trails the series with OSU 6-11-1 (1-5-1 in Corvallis). See sidebar on page 2 for complete series notes.

> Utah is 1-1 against OSU in Thursday games, losing in Corvallis in 2007 and winning in Salt Lake City in 2008.

EXTRA SPECIAL TEAMS

According to the ESPN analytics team, Utah's special teams this season are the best since that of Miami in 2004. ESPN's metrics evaluate everything a special teams unit does, taking into account the context of a play (down and distance, yards from the end zone, clock), as well as "expected points added." Utah's special teams are contributing 7.8 points a game to its scoring margin. Miami's special teams "expected points added" average in 2004 was 8.0 points a game.

STATCHAT

Utah leads the nation in net punting (45.20 yards). Of Utah's 30 punts, just seven have been returned (for a total of 23 yards). **Tom Hackett** ranks second nationally and first in the Pac-12 in punt average (48.0) ... **Kaelin Clay** is the only player in the country this season with three punt returns for touchdowns and four total returns (1 kickoff) for a touchdown. He ranks fourth in the nation in punt return average (23.1). Utah ranks No.8 in the nation in punt return average (19.07) ... The Utes rank second in the Pac-12 in rushing defense (113.4 ypg) ... Utah ranks 11th nationally in turnover margin (1.2 average, 9 gained/3 lost). Utah's three turnovers lost is tied for second-fewest in the country ... Utah's 10 sacks against UCLA is tied for the most by any team in a

UTAH-OSU SERIES

Series Snapshot

Utah trails the series with OSU 11-6-1. The first Pac-12 Conference win in Utah football history was against the Beavers in 2011—27-8 in Salt Lake City. Utah has won four of the last seven games, though OSU has won the last two. The Beavers lead 5-1-1 in Corvallis and 5-4 in Salt Lake City. The teams are 1-1 in neutral site games.

Travis Wilson passed for 279 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for a career-high 142 yards and three TDs in a 51-48 overtime loss to Oregon State. Utah came back from a 27-10 deficit behind Wilson, Bubba Poole (117 yards rushing, 70 yards receiving) and Dres Anderson (101 yards receiving). Utah tied it up 45-45 on Wilson's 9-yard run with 0:21 left in regulation. Andy Phillips made a 41-yard field goal in OT before OSU scored the winning TD. Reginald Porter, Jason Whittingham and Hunter Dimick had eight tackles apiece.

TWO MINUTE DRILL

In conference play against Pac-12 teams, Utah is 0-2 in Thursday games (USC in 2012 and UCLA in 2013). The Utes are 2-3 all-time in Thursday games against Pac-12 opponents (1-1 vs. Oregon State) ... **Kyle Whittingham** earned career victory No. 80 against UCLA. Whittingham is 80-40 in his 10th season as Utah's head coach. He has participated in 165 wins in 21 total years on the staff—including 10 years as an assistant coach—which is the most by any football coach in school history ... Ute cornerbacks' coach **Sharrieff Shah** led Utah to its only victory to date in Corvallis in 1991. He had 12 tackles against OSU, including four sacks and five tackles for loss, and forced two fumbles. He was named the *Sports Illustrated* National Defensive Player of the Week ... Utah is 1-0 coming off a bye this season with a win over Michigan on Sept. 20. **Whittingham** is 7-4 after regular-season byes. His victories came over Wyoming (2005, 2007), Colorado State (2006, 2009), New Mexico (2008), Iowa State (2010) and Michigan. Losses were to Washington (2011), USC (2012), UCLA (2013) and Arizona State (2013).

IN THE HUDDLE

After Utah's win over UCLA in its last game on Oct. 4, **Nate Orchard** was named the FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week, the Chuck Bednarik Award Player of the week, the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week and the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) Defensive Lineman of the Week. Also honored were **Andy Phillips** as a Lou Groza Star of the Week and **Tom Hackett** as the Ray Guy Award Player of the Week and the CFPA National Punter of the Week ... **Dres Anderson** has 2,012 career receiving yards and is just the fifth player in school history to reach 2,000 career receiving yards ... Redshirt freshman **Evan Egginman** (Hillsboro, Ore./Liberty HS), who plays on special teams, is the lone Oregon native on the roster ... In last year's 51-48 overtime loss to Oregon State, **Travis Wilson** passed for 279 yards and two touchdowns, and rushed for a career-high 142 yards and three TDs ... 11 true freshmen have played: **Christian Drews**, **Jameson Field**, **Andre Godfrey**, **Wallace Gonzalez**, **Boobie Hobbs**, **Lowell Lotulelei**, **Nick Mika**, **Monte Seabrook**, **Marcus Williams**, **Tavaris Williams** and **Kenric Young**.

LAST GAME

Andy Phillips hit a 29-yard field goal with 0:34 remaining and Utah stunned No. 8 UCLA 30-28 in the Rose Bowl on Oct. 4. UCLA had taken its first lead of the game (28-27) on the possession prior to Phillips' kick and had one last chance to score, but missed a 50-yard field goal with no time left. **Kendal Thompson** replaced **Travis Wilson** at quarterback on the fourth drive of the game and completed 10-of-13 passes for 95 yards, including a 42-yard touchdown pass to **Dres Anderson**. Thompson also ran for 83 yards while directing all of Utah's offensive scoring drives. **Devontae Booker** rushed for 156 yards and a touchdown and Phillips made field goals of 45 and 48 yards in ad-

UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

Utah's all-time football record is 637-443-31. The Utes are 389-183-16 at home (71-26 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 229-243-12 in road games and 19-17-3 in games played at neutral sites.

UTAH VS. THE PAC-12

Utah is 86-139-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools with this breakdown by team: Arizona (20-17-2), Arizona State (6-19), California (4-5), Colorado (26-31-3), Oregon (8-19), Oregon State (6-11-1), USC (3-9), Stanford (3-3), UCLA (3-10), Washington (0-8), Washington State (7-7).

WHITTINGHAM FILE

Tenth-year Utah head coach **Kyle Whittingham**, the 2008 National Coach of the Year, has an 80-40 career record that includes seven bowl victories—among them a 2009 Sugar Bowl win over No. 4 Alabama. His teams have played in eight bowl games and won seven. For more on Whittingham, see sidebar on page 2.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

> Both **Travis Wilson** and **Kendal Thompson** have played in every game for the Utes. The starter for the OSU game will not be revealed until Utah's first offensive series in Corvallis.

> **Wilson** has started all five games and is 4-1 this season and 11-10 in his career. **Thompson** (0-0 as the starter) directed all of the scoring drives in Utah's 30-28 win over UCLA after relieving Wilson on the fourth offensive series of the game.

> **Wilson**, a 6'7" junior, who became the starter in the seventh game of his true freshman year, has played in 26 of Utah's 29 games since 2012. He missed the last three games of 2013 with an injury.

> **Wilson** is 58-for-101 (57.4%) passing for 788 yards, seven touchdowns and no interceptions.

> With 3,926 passing yards, **Wilson** needs just 74 more yards to become the 12th player in school history to throw for 4,000 yards.

> **Wilson's** 30 career touchdown passes ties him for eighth place in school history. He needs one to tie Brett Ratliff (31 from 2005-2006) for seventh and three to tie Jordan Wynn (33 from 2009-12) for sixth.

> **Thompson**, a transfer from Oklahoma in his first season at Utah, is 24-for-39 passing for 284 yards, two touchdowns and an interception.

> **Thompson** ranks second on the team in rushes (42) and third in net rushing yards (144).

> Against UCLA, **Thompson** was 10-for-13 passing for 95 yards, including his second touchdown pass of the season (42 yards to Dres Anderson).

> **Thompson** set career highs in both passing (95) and rushing (83) yards at UCLA.

> 65% of **Booker's** season carries and net yards have come in the last two games, when he is averaging 167.0 yards per game.

> **Booker** is fifth in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game (102.6), sixth in all-purpose yards per game (130.2), and seventh in rushing touchdowns (4).

> **Booker** has two 100-yard games this season: 178 vs. Washington State and 156 vs. UCLA.

> **Poole** started the first four games and ranks second on the team in yards (145) and yards per rush (4.4), and is tied for second in carries (33). He has one touchdown.

RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

> Senior **Dres Anderson**, the fifth receiver in Utah history to reach 2,000 career yards (2,012), leads the 2014 Utes in receiving yards (290), yards per catch (19.33) and touchdown receptions (4). He ranks second in receptions (15).

> **Anderson** needs 156 more yards to tie Dennis Smith (2,168 yards from 1986-89) for fourth all-time at Utah.

> **Anderson** has one 100-yard game this season and seven in his career, which ties him for fourth in school history: 141 vs. BYU (2013), 129 vs. Washington State (2013), 111 vs. Idaho State (2014), 106 vs. UCLA (2013), 103 vs. Weber State (2013), 101 vs. Oregon State (2013) and 100 vs. Arizona State (2013).

> **Anderson** has 17 career touchdown catches, which is tied for sixth in school history.

> Junior **Kenneth Scott** leads Utah in receptions (22) and is second on the team in receiving yards (228) and touchdown catches (3).

> **Scott** led Utah with 70 yards against WSU on a career-high seven catches. His season high is 77 yards vs. Fresno State.

> **Kaelin Clay** has started the last three games and has 13 catches for 129 yards.

O-LINE/TIGHT END NOTEBOOK

> **Jeremiah Poutasi** (LT), **Isaac Asiata** (RG) and **J.J. Dielman** (RT) have started all five games.

> **Poutasi** has played in 28 games in his career with 27 starts. The junior is in his second year at left tackle after playing right tackle as a true freshman in 2012.

> **Poutasi** has played 343 snaps while allowing just one sack. He was named Utah's Most Physical Offensive Lineman of the Week against both ISU and Fresno State.

> **Asiata** started the first four games at right guard before moving to left guard last week. The sophomore has nine career starts, including four last season at right tackle.

> **Asiata** has participated in 322 plays without allowing a sack.

> First-year starting sophomore right tackle **Dielman** has played 348 snaps (most of the Ute offensive linemen).

> **Dielman** was named the team's Most Physical Offensive Lineman of the Week twice (Michigan, Washington State).

> **Siaosi Aiono** has started the last four games at center after sitting out the opener. The junior has 12 career starts, including eight last year at right tackle.

> In 271 plays, **Aiono** has not allowed a sack. His six cuts against UCLA are the most by a Ute OL this season.

> **Phillips** is tied for second in the NCAA in field goals of 40+ yards with seven (7-of-9) and has makes of 43, 45, 46, 47, 48 (twice) and 50 yards. His misses were from 41 and 46 yards—both coming in rainy, windy conditions.

> In his career, **Phillips** is 16-of-20 (80%) from 40+ yards.

> **Phillips** is tied for 10th in the nation and leads the Pac-12 in scoring (10.8 points per game).

> **Phillips** is tied for fifth in the NCAA and is second in the Pac-12 in field goals per game (2.0).

> **Phillips** is 10-for-12 (83.3%) in field goals this season and his 10 made fields goals ranks second in the Pac-12.

> **Phillips** was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week vs. Michigan and has twice been named the Lou Groza Star of the Week (vs. Michigan and UCLA).

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

> Head coach **Kyle Whittingham** is in his first season as the special teams' coordinator.

> Utah leads the nation in net punting (44.20 yards). Of Utah's 30 punts, just seven have been returned (for a total of 23 yards).

> The Utes rank eighth nationally in punt return average (19.07) and are ninth in kick return average (26.40) while ranking second in the conference in both categories.

> Utah is ranked 14th in the nation in kickoff return defense (16.92) and 15th in punt return defense (3.29).

> In his first season, senior **Kaelin Clay** leads the Pac-12 and ranks fourth in the nation in punt return average (23.1). He has 10 returns for 231 yards and three touchdowns.

> **Clay** is the only player in the country this season with three punt returns for touchdowns and four total returns (1 kickoff) for a touchdown.

> Three of **Clay's** 10 punt returns this year have gone for touchdowns (66 yards vs. Michigan, 46 yards vs. Idaho State and 58 yards vs. Washington State). One of his five kickoff returns was also for a touchdown (100 yards vs. Idaho State).

> **Clay's** three punt return touchdowns ties the Utah single-season record set by Steve Smith (currently of the NFL's Baltimore Ravens) in 1999. He needs one more to tie the Utah career record of four set by Steve Odum (1971-73).

> **Clay** also leads Utah with five kick returns for 184 yards (36.8 average) with one touchdown.

> **Clay** was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week the first week of the season against Idaho State after returning a punt (46 yards) and kickoff (100 yards) for touchdowns.

> **Clay's** punt return for a touchdown against ISU came on his first touch as a Ute.

> Sophomore **Chase Dominguez** has handled all of the special teams' snaps since last fall, which includes 106 punt, 32 field goal and 65 PATs for a total of 203 snaps.

KYLE WHITTINGHAM SAYS

"We feel we made the most of the bye week and are looking forward to getting back in action this Thursday night against Oregon State in Corvallis. We need to continue taking care of the football offensively and being opportunistic on defense and special teams. The Beavers are also coming off of a bye so both teams will be rested and prepared."

CAPACITY CROWDS

Utah has played to 28-straight sellouts in Rice-Eccles Stadium extending back to the 2010 season-opener against Pittsburgh. Of the sellouts, 25 were played before standing-room only crowds that exceeded Rice-Eccles Stadium's seating capacity (45,017 from 1998-13; 45,807 starting this season). For the seventh-consecutive season, all 32,000 allotted season tickets were sold.

COACHES' CORNER

Three members of Utah's staff have been head coaches at the NCAA level: head coach **Kyle Whittingham**, offensive coordinator **Dave Christensen** (Wyoming) and running backs coach **Dennis Erickson** (Idaho, Wyoming, Washington State, Miami, Oregon State and Arizona State). PASADENA, Calif.—Andy Phillips hit a 29-yard field goal with 0:34 remaining and Utah stunned No. 8 UCLA 30-28 in the Rose Bowl on Oct. 4. UCLA had taken its first lead of the game (28-27) on the possession prior to Phillips' kick and had one last chance to score, but missed a 50-yard field goal with no time left. Kendal Thompson replaced Travis Wilson at quarterback on the fourth drive of the game and completed 10-of-13 passes for 95 yards, including a 42-yard touchdown pass to Dres Anderson. Thompson also ran for 83 yards while directing all of Utah's offensive scoring drives. Devontae Booker rushed for 156 yards and a touchdown and Phillips made field goals of 45 and 48 yards in addition to his game-winner. Tevin Carter scored the first TD on a 27-yard interception return and the Utes sacked UCLA's Brett Hundley 10 times, including a school record-tying four by Nate Orchard, who also had a team-high 11 tackles.
